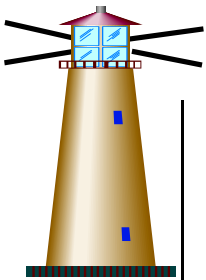

Christian Education/Spiritual Formation:

In Acts chapter 8, after the stoning of Peter, during a time of much persecution of the early Christians (especially by Saul), there is a story of Philip. Philip heard the call of God to go south from Jerusalem towards Gaza. He met an Ethiopian Eunuch, in charge of the Queen of Ethiopia's treasury, traveling on the same road, seated in his chariot reading from the prophet Isaiah. Philip felt God calling him to approach the chariot. Philip asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" The Eunuch replied, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" So, Philip sat down and began to use the passage to preach the good news about Jesus. The Eunuch listened and asked to be baptized with water they passed along the way.

Each year, each week, people from this congregation hear God calling them to be the guides. They spend time in prayer and study to help lead God's people into deeper relationship with Him. We call them teachers, coordinators, speakers, facilitators. We call them our Education Ministry Team. In their honor this year we are donating two Dream Baskets through Heifer, International. Our children/youth have been supporting both Heifer, Int., and Sojourner House with their offerings this year. The Dream Baskets are filled with shares of a sheep, heifer, goat, rabbits, and a flock of ducks and chicks. These animals give families milk for nutrition and a source of income for school supplies, medicine, doctor expenses and improved quality of living. The Heifer Dream Baskets offer hope a family needs for a sustainable future; and this hope continues as each family passes on gifts of animals and training to another.

Food Pantry Holds Third Annual Collection of Baby Care Items

The number of young families being served by the Wallace Food Pantry continues to grow, and the demand for diapers, baby wipes, and baby food is growing just as quickly. To help adequately stock our pantry with these essential items, we are holding our third annual **Baby Care Item Collection** at Wallace on Sunday, June 06, 2010 {the past two years, this event was held on Mother's Day, but it will now be held the first Sunday of each June in recognition of International Children's Day, which falls on June 01}. Items most urgently needed include: disposable diapers {all sizes}, baby wipes, baby juices and baby food {especially fruits}. 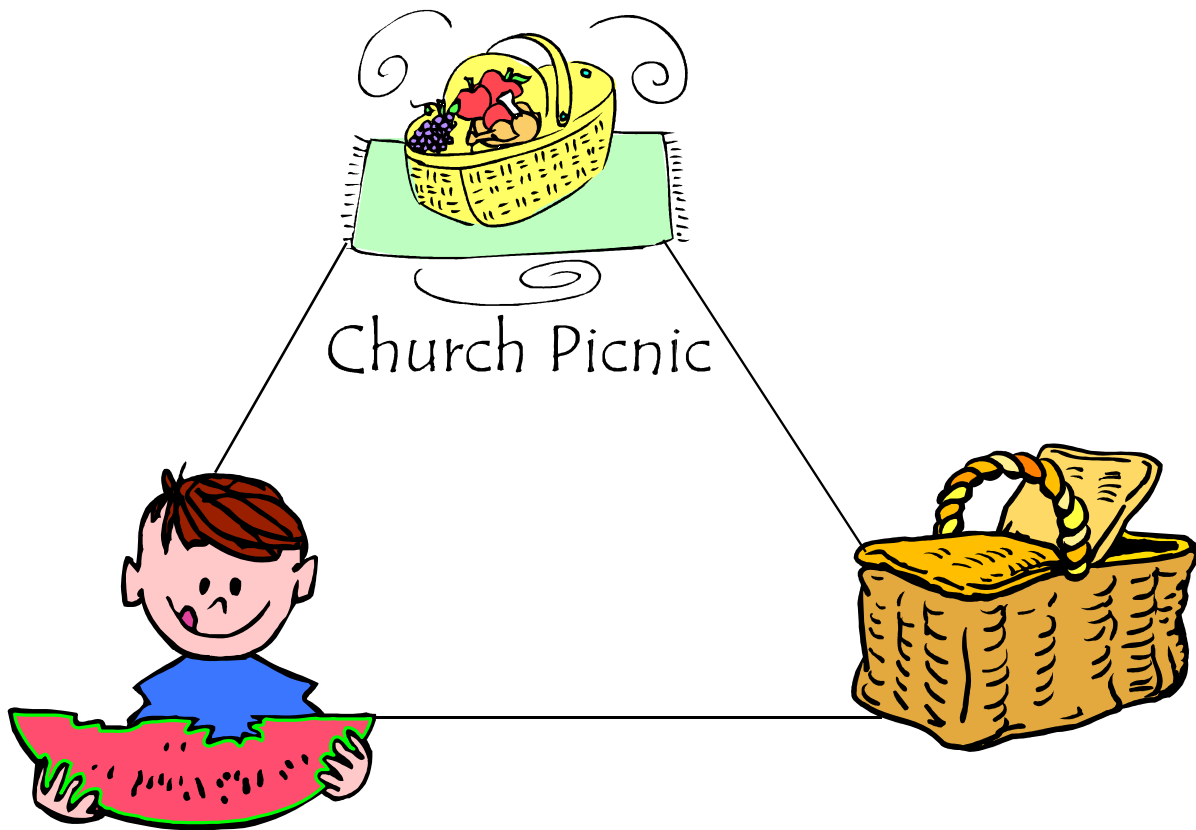
